# 1 Sanctuary of the Madonna di San Biagio, Montepulciano

Via di S. Biagio, 20, 53045 San Biagio SI, Italy

An engaging and captivating 16th century Renaissance church, which was built by the Italian architect, Antonio da Sangallo the Elder. Decorative and imposing, the church has an entrancing dome, bell tower and was designed in a form of a Greek cross.

#### 2 Fortezza Medicea, Montepulciano

Via di S. Donato, 53045 Montepulciano SI, Italy

Fortezza Medicea, the Medici Fortress, is a 13th-century fortress built by the historic Republic of Siena. Located in a topographically strategic high point, which in old times was supposed to protect the city from its enemies. Situated near Piazza Grande, Fortezza Medicea underwent many changes and reconstructions during the centuries. Today, the place serves as a cultural center and hosts a variety of art exhibitions and conferences.

#### **3** Cathedral Saint Mary of The Assumption, Montepulciano

Piazza Grande, 53045 Montepulciano SI, Italy

Located in beautiful Piazza Grande, Cathedral Saint Mary of The Assumption is the central Catholic worship place for the people of Montepulciano. Cattedrale di Santa Maria Assunta (Duomo di Montepulciano) was built during the 17th century but consecrated in 1712. However, the religious roots of the place are much longer since it was built on an earlier 15th-century church, and the bell tower of the original church still stands. The church has a lovely rustic-like façade, and the interior has magnificent artworks, including an early 15th century Assumption of the Virgin triptych by Taddeo di Bartolo.

#### **4** Contucci, Montepulciano

Contucci is a marvelous winery and vinyards which stay in the family for generations and centuries. The Contucci family had a vital role in the Montepulciano wine industry, even during Renaissance days. They were part of those who helped to create and developed the original Vino Nobile di Montepulciano wine, as was first documented in 1773. You may stop at Contucci and enjoy wine tasting at the winery and also, by booking in advance, receive a guided group tour.

#### **5** Piazza Grande, Montepulciano

Piazza Grande, 53045 Montepulciano SI, Italy

The center of Montepulciano and the highest point in this charming hilltop town, Piazza Grande is locals' favorite for gathering and celebrations for centuries. The vivid square is full of cafes and is moments from many of the town's attractions. It is right next to the Cathedral Saint Mary of The Assumption and has a lovely fountain named II Pozzo dei Grifi e dei Leoni. It is surrounded by wonderful medieval and Renaissance buildings like the 16th-century Palazzo Contucci which belong to the Contucci family and the magnificent 13th-century town hall, Palazzo Comunale. Palazzo Comunale with its bell tower provides a stunning panoramic view of the town and the beautiful Tuscan landscape around.

#### 12 Avignonesi Palace, Montepulciano

Via di Gracciano nel Corso, 91, 53045 Montepulciano SI, Italy

The elegant Palazzo Avignonesi is one of the most impressive buildings in Montepulciano. A Renaissance palace from the 16th century, designed by the notable Italian architect, Giacomo Barozzi da Vignola. It used to belong to the Avignonesi family, which as many of the oldest families in Montepulciano, has also an ancient wine cellar. Palazzo Avignonesi today contains 170 hackers of vineyards and offers tours, fantastic wine tasting, wine bar, magnificent gourmet dinners, and even cooking classes.
