① **Hungarian Parliament Building, Budapest**

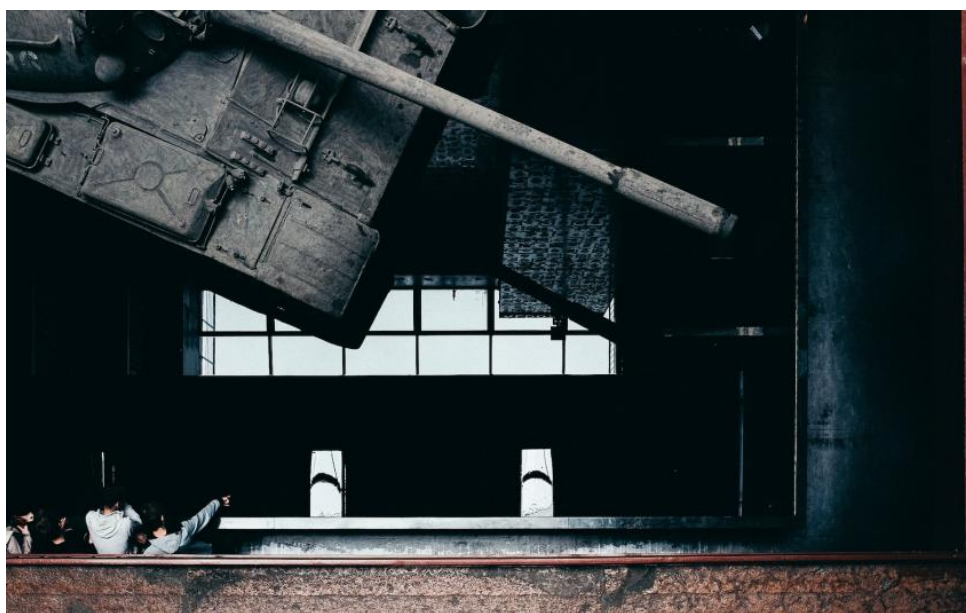

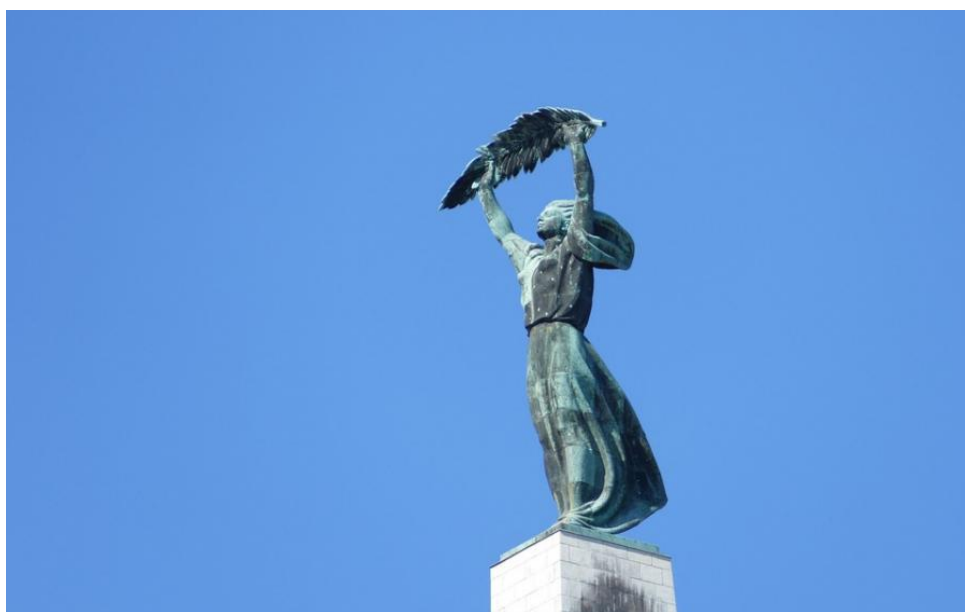
