① Reichstag Building, Berlin

Platz der Republik 1, 11011 Berlin, Germany

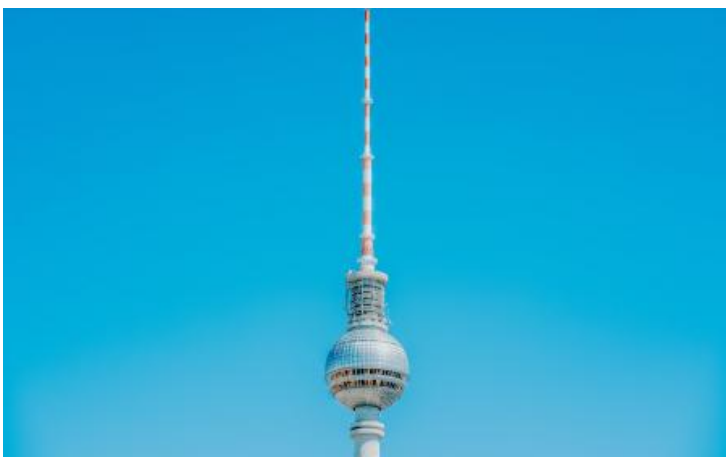
