① 09:00 - 10:30 Accademia Gallery, Florence

The Accademia Gallery (Galleria dell'Accademia) is another must-visit museum in Florence. It is one of the most famous museums in the city, known for its impressive collection of Renaissance art. The museum is home to the phenomenal marble statue of David, by Michelangelo, as well as other works by the artist such as the four unfinished Prisoners. ② 11:00 - 11:30 Piazza del Duomo, Florence

Piazza del Duomo, 50122 Firenze FI, Italy

Piazza del Duomo, the Cathedral Square, is an embodiment of Florence. Timeless beauty, captivating, popular, with rich history and exceptional architecture. As part of the historic center of Florence, Piazza del Duomo is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

The square contains some of the most iconic places in the city. First and foremost is the Basilica of Santa Maria del Fiore which its dome is one of Florence's most recognizable symbols. Another landmark you can find at Piazza del Duomo is the Florence Baptistery (Battistero di San Giovanni). The Baptistery resides in a magnificent antique Romanesque building with an exquisite interior and contains the Tomb of Antipope John XXIII. Also, Piazza del Duomo includes Campanile di Giotto, Giotto's Bell Tower, a wonderful 85 meters bell tower from the 14th century.

③ 11:30 - 12:30 Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, Florence

The Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore (Florence Cathedral) is the largest church in Europe and the third-largest in the world after San Pietro in Rome and San Paolo in London. The red-brown

dome of the cathedral is one of the most iconic images of Florence. The outstanding Roman Catholic cathedral is UNESCO World Heritage Site and is mesmerizing, in and out.

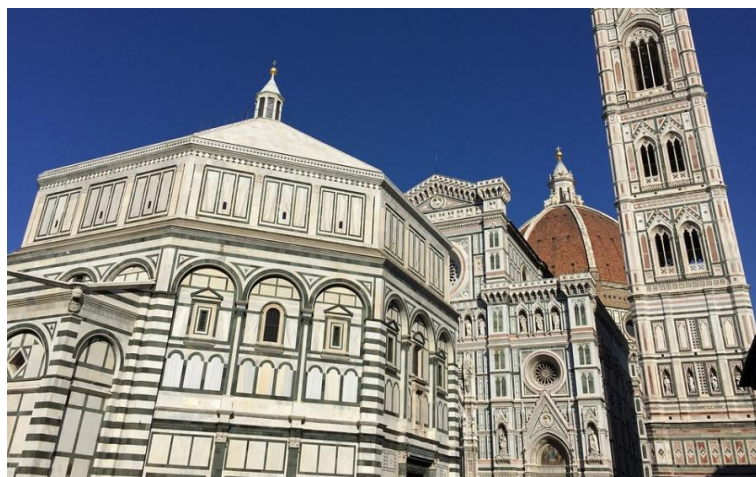

④ **12:30 - 13:00** The Baptistery of St. John, Florence

The Baptistery of St. John (or Florence Baptistery) is one of the oldest buildings in Florence, dating back to the 4th century AD. The baptistery is known for its beautiful mosaics and the famous "Gates of Paradise" door by Ghiberti. Visitors can also explore the octagonal shape of the building and the acoustics of the dome.
