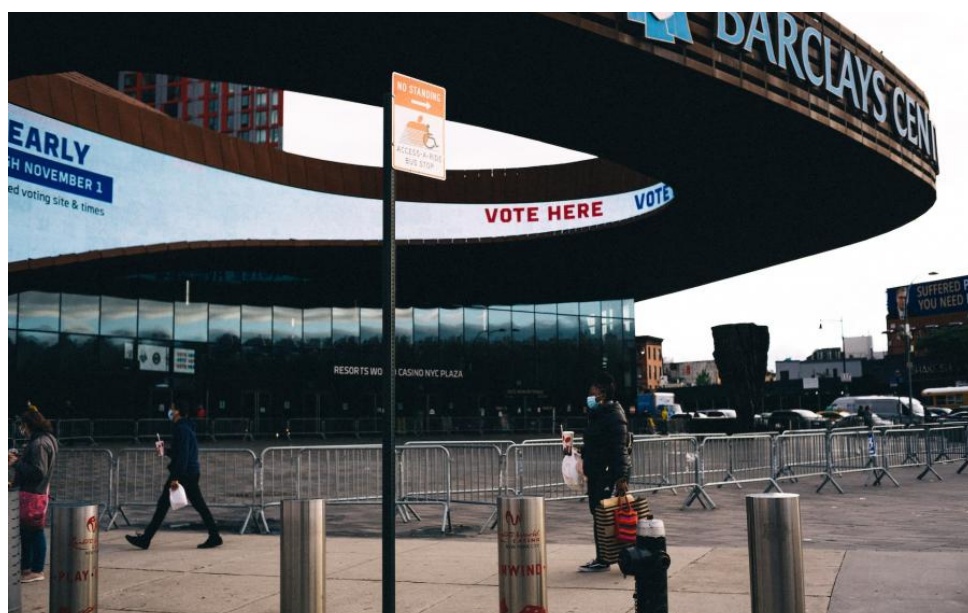
## ⑤ Barclays Center, New York
