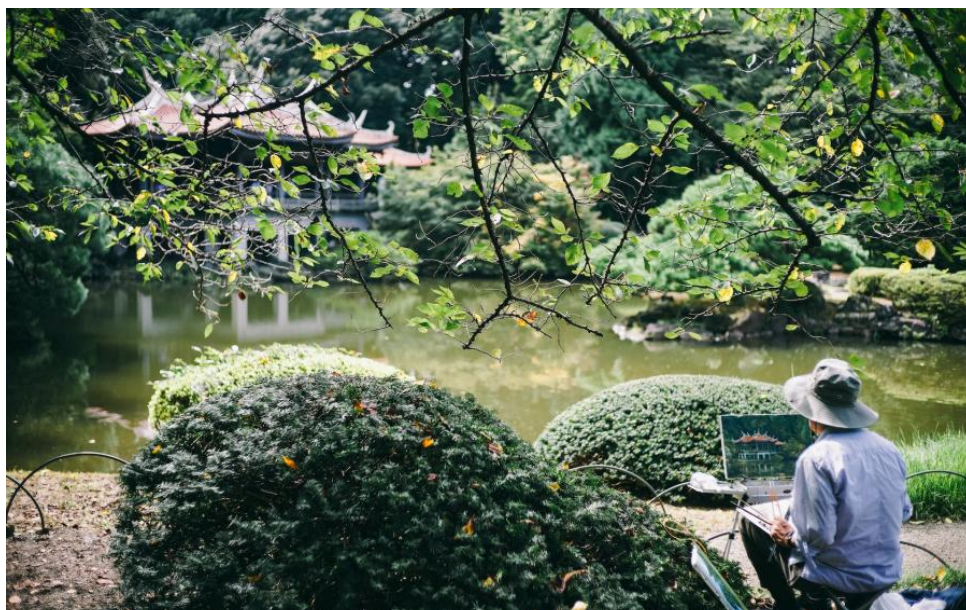

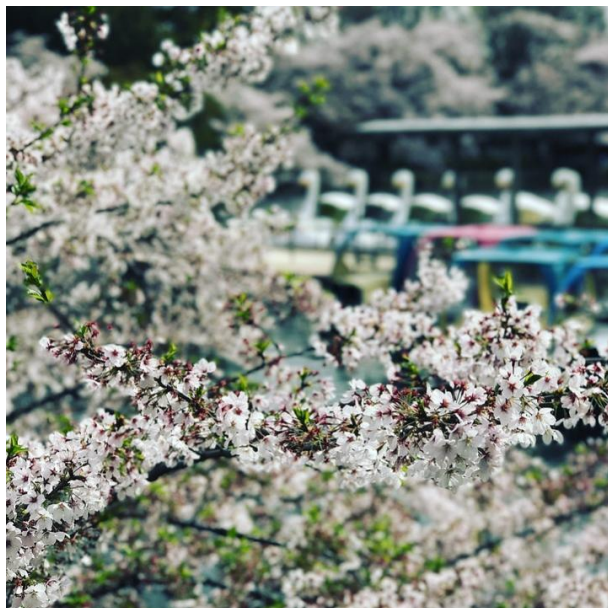


### ④ Inokashira Park, Tokyo
