① 07:30 Tōdai-ji, Nara

Home to the Great Buddha (Daibutsu), Todai-ji Temple is a cultural treasure in Nara. The colossal bronze statue, housed in the Daibutsuden Hall, is one of the world's largest representations of Buddha. The temple complex, established in 752, exudes ancient grandeur and spiritual significance. Visiting Todai-ji offers a profound encounter with Japanese Buddhism and a glimpse into Nara's rich history.

② 08:30 Nara Park
